Certified Supply Chain Professional (CSCP)

A new industry educational and certification program created to focus on the entire supply chain...supplier through operations to customers and beyond...and meet the ever expanding needs of supply chain management.

Becoming a CSCP candidate

The CSCP examination is available to individuals who have relevant work experience and/or education and would like to advance their careers by obtaining a broader understanding and increasing their knowledge on all areas that make up the supply chain.

Eligibility for the CSCP Exam

Candidates must submit a request to qualify to take the exam. This request form is found on the APICS national website - www.apics.org. To be eligible for the CSCP exam a candidate must meet one of the following criteria.

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent, plus two years of related business experience, or
- CPIM, CFPIM, CIRM, or C.P.M. Designation plus two years of related business experience, or
- Five years of related business experience.

Instructor Led Class in 2012

Instructor led class will be held in Columbia, S.C. at Moore School of Business, University of South Carolina. Classes are scheduled on Saturday; one each month for five months for the individuals to accomplish the required reading before each class.
